Members' Code of Conduct

To guide staff, members and volunteers in carrying out their responsibilities and duties in a fair and respectful manner, the Board of Directors has adopted the:

Rotary International "4-Way Test"

Is it the truth? Will it build goodwill and better friendships?

Will it be beneficial to all concerned? Is it fair to all concerned?

- Support the fundamental right to a safe and trusted physical and emotional environment that is free from harm
- * Respect the dignity, rights and views of others
- Any sexual misconduct or inappropriate behaviour of a sexual nature is to be reported to staff immediately
- ❖ Any form of aggressive, threatening or abusive behaviour, fighting, physical or verbal threats or harassment, annoying others through noisy or boisterous activities or other disturbances is unacceptable
- Defacing, damaging, or destroying of personal or agency property is unacceptable
- ❖ Alcohol is not allowed on premises, unless part of an agency-approved function or rental with a liquor permit
- Soliciting asking for money, contributions or donations is not allowed on premises unless part of an agency-approved function or approved by Administration
- ❖ Individuals or groups cannot assemble on agency property for the purpose of disturbing the public peace or committing an unlawful act
- Certified companion animals are always welcome; permission from Administration required for other animals
- Posting and/or distribution of non-agency materials requires permission from Administration
- ❖ Always respect others' privacy, so request permission before taking pictures or audio/video recording anyone at the agency

Violations of our code of conduct may result in that individual's removal from the agency's properties and/or revocation of his/her membership.
